 - B. We pray because God deserves the honor of all people
 - C. We pray because Christ died for the rescue of all people
3. The Implication (Since we pray we must also preach)
4. The Impact (a brief look at eternity Revelation 5:9-10)

Questions:

1. What are the different kinds of prayer mentioned in verse 1? What are the different roles of those four categories?
2. What specifically should believers pray for in this passage?
3. In what ways is praying the easiest thing to do? In what ways is it difficult?
4. Who are different people you pray for in your life? How do you pray for different people differently? In what ways are your prayers the same?
5. What about people you don't like? How do you pray for them? How can prayers affect your attitudes toward our political leaders?
6. Is our country safe to share the Gospel in? Why or why not? Are there advantages to sharing the Gospel in America? What rights do we have as opposed to other countries? What are some disadvantages we have to sharing the Gospel in America?
7. Cody talked about God's decreed will and His declared will. How does having an understanding of the difference help us avoid universalism (all will be saved) on one hand or compromising God's sovereignty on the other?

8. How would you describe sovereignty to a group of high schoolers? How would you express man's responsibility for his own actions in the light of God's sovereignty?

9. Why is it important that Jesus is fully God? What is it so important that Jesus is fully man?

10. How does it encourage you to know that Christians are praying for you right now?
